An Industrial Health Section was established in LD in 1954.

First Industrial Health Officer (IHO) 'on loan' from DMHS after the enactment of F&IUO in 1955

The Industrial Health Officer with occupational hygiene training was formally seconded from DMHS to LD in March 1956.

Equipment including
Konimeter and Thermal
Precipitator were acquired by
the Industrial Health Officer
for workplace monitoring.

What did Industrial Hygiene covered in 1950s?

Three main areas:

- Radioactive substances
 - **Silicosis**
 - Lead poisoning

Manpower of Industrial Hygiene Services in 1950s

- **1 IHO**
- 1 Labour Inspector seconded from other LD unit

Industrial Health Section was charged with:

- Prevention of ODs
 - Medical surveillance
 - **Health education**
- Factory hygiene
- Field survey and research

- Industrial hygiene works covered:
- Dust monitoring in dusty trades
- Solvent exposure in artificial pearl factories
 - Setting up pilot plant to determine most effective ventilation system for dipping trays


- Industrial hygiene works covered:
- Monitoring Thorium nitrate in mantle factories
 - Heat stress survey measuring dry bulb temp., RH, air velocity and radiant heat

- Industrial hygiene works covered:
- Environmental SO₂ monitoring at Tsing Lung Tau
 - Industrial pollution monitoring of Indus River from dyeing, metal and tanning industries

Industrial hygiene works covered:

Vetting 134 proposals (in 1962) for new factory buildings in the areas of ventilation, lighting and medical, sanitary and welfare facilities

2 Laboratory Assistants (LA) seconded from other departments to assist in industrial hygiene surveys More equipment acquired including Kata thermometer and Velometer





- Set up Industrial Hygiene Lab in Kowloon Hospital
- First LA sent to attend 1 year IH course in London

Radiation Ordinance enacted, removing radiation control duties from F&IUO

- HKG set up Committee on Air Pollution
- IH Unit set up 4 SO₂
 monitoring stations QEH,
 Hung Hom Estate, Kowloon
 Hospital and Sham Shui Po

Industrial Hygiene Laboratory in Kowloon Hospital designated a national laboratory by WHO, and took part in international air pollution control program

• Environmental SO₂ monitoring station gradually increased to 10

1974

Air Pollution Control Officer appointed to head Air **Pollution Control Unit (APCU) Environmental SO₂ monitoring** duties transferred to APCU (later upgraded to APCD, then EPD)

- 3 Industrial Hygienist posts approved in 1976 but not filled
- 3 IH appointed on 1 September1998

1981

- Industrial Health Division renamed Occupational Health Division
- The title of Occupational Hygienist first appeared in this year
